The Pleasantview Christmas Tree business consists of the downtown Cumberland Pleasantview Christmas Tree Lot and the 16-acre Pleasantview Christmas Tree Farm where we started planting the first (of many) Fraser Fir and Balsam Fir bare root seedlings in 2021. The long-term plan is that the 4,000 trees at the farm will be the future tree source for the Cumberland tree lot and an option for customers wanting to experience cutting their own tree. Currently, we purchase wholesale Fraser and Balsam Fir trees to sell at our downtown tree lot.

The Pleasantview Christmas Tree Lot is conveniently located in downtown Cumberland on the corner of 1st Avenue & Hwy. 48. with safe, easy access, and off-street parking. The tree lot officially opens each year the day after Thanksgiving. The Cumberland community may purchase a fresh-cut Fraser or Balsam Fir tree, wreath, swag, garland, porch pot, and other holiday crafts and gifts from our cozy, warm retail building. It's a great way to kick-off the holiday season.

The Pleasantview Tree Lot will be open on weekends, during the week, and evenings until all trees are sold. We will also be available by-appointment if needed, and happy to accommodate special needs and requests, including local tree delivery.

The Pleasantview Tree Lot sales is the only source of income to offset the tree lot and the tree farm expenses. Currently we do not have regular PT or FT employees. We get help from family and friends at times when the tree lot is open and have hired Cumberland High School students to help at the tree farm with seasonal mowing, weed management, and mulching.

As a new business, we appreciate the support from our local suppliers and partners—Cumberland Chamber of Commerce; Cumberland Advocate; Artisan/Earthquake; Cumberland Ace Hardware; Dairy State Bank; JAK & Associates; Skinner Funeral Home; Schell Power and Light, and Project Santa.

Q10. What is the plan for using the grant money (How will it be used)?

We are committed to investing in the Cumberland Tree Lot consistent with the same festive, inviting, and holiday feel of the other downtown businesses. Maintaining a focus on the expectations and quality experience of our customer will drive maximizing our investments and growing the business as a quality asset to the Cumberland community.

Grant funds would be used for both Pleasantview Tree Lot and Tree Farm and business expenses.

Tree Lot expenses: installing a basic security system; providing a separate metered electrical service for the tree lot building and outdoor lights for early evening hours; upgrade and expand the tree display capacity; a new Tree Lot building (comfortable and warm place) for the customer's pay counter, some retail shopping and a place to enjoy a cup of hot cider; purchasing wholesale trees; components needed to build wreaths and the outdoor decorations; increasing the marketing spend for advertising, to build out the website and tree lot building signage.

Tree Farm expenses: field and tree applications-fertilizer, mulch, and deer spray; hiring seasonal help for mowing, applying mulch and early weed control for the 4,000 Fraser and Balsam trees.

Q11. Projected benefit of plan execution (e.g. viability of business, growth/expansion of business, impact on the community, etc...)

There is now a Christmas tree lot in Cumberland, Pleasantview Christmas Trees. Below are some of the comments we here from customers:

"We were here last year. I like the new look."

"This is so convenient. Sure makes it easy."

"You have really good-looking trees, again this year."

"Thanks for delivering the tree last year. Hopefully you can deliver it this year too."

"I'll have you bail the tree for me."

"Love what you're doing."

"A regular wreath, cross wreath and stand for the cemetery is perfect. Thanks."

"Thank you. See you next year. We'll be back."

We continued to hear people comment on "how nice the experience was"—from bailing and loading the tree into their vehicle, to the option of delivering the tree to their home, the fair pricing and tree quality, and the flexible payment options of cash, check or credit card.

YEAR ONE. Our first year was 2024. We exceeded expectations with product sales, positive customer feedback and selling all the trees early. So, for 2025 we purchased 30% more trees, offered more holiday related products, expanded our hours, and made many tree lot improvements.

YEAR TWO. We ended 2025 with an increase in sales over 2024, more positive customer feedback, returning customers and selling all the trees too early, again. Selling out early is not our goal. Rather, we would like to also accommodate those who prefer to purchase and set-up their tree closer to Christmas day. 2026 we'll have even more trees

We learned not everyone is interested in the cut-your-own option, the convenience is valued, the prices were fair, the options for Christmas decorations were perfect and a nice warm place with cookies and cider was appreciated.

The comments and compliments from both new and returning customers seem to indicate we have made a good choice to call Cumberland home for Pleasantview Christmas Trees.

We appreciate the commitment your members have made to support the local business environment.
